Admiral Yi Sun-sin: One of the Greatest Heroes in Korean History ▶ 03-01

When Koreans are asked which historic figure they respect the most, nine out of ten Koreans might answer King Sejong or Admiral Yi Sun-sin. Statues of these heroes stand at the center of Gwangwhamun Square, one of the most vibrant places in Seoul. Due to Admiral Yi's leadership, Korean naval forces won the Imjin War (1592-1598) between Korea and Japan. Admiral Yi won all 23 battles that he fought. Without his wisdom, sacrifice, and victories, Koreans would not live peacefully on the Korean Peninsula and use the Korean language and flag.



Childhood and Military Examination ▶ 03-02

Yi Sun-sin was born in Seoul in 1545. In his early childhood, he moved to Asan, a small town in South Chungcheong Province. He grew up there, studying and enjoying wargames with his friends. In 1572 at the age of 28, he took the national military exam but failed it after falling off his horse. Four years later in 1576, he finally passed the test. When he was



32 years old, he began his career as a low-ranking officer in the northern frontier. He faced many challenges during his military career because he did not join any factions and rigidly stuck to his principles.

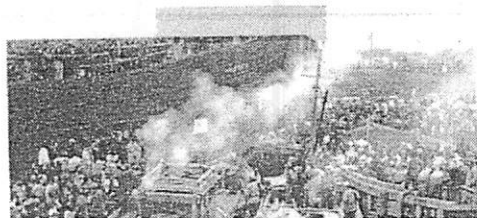

The Miracle of the War: The Heungnam Evacuation and the "Ship of Miracles"

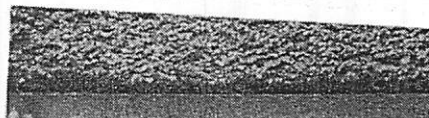
The Heungnam Evacuation happened when UN forces and North Korean civilians were evacuated from the port of Heungnam, North Korea, in December 1950. During the rescue, the *Meredith Victory*, a merchant ship, played a central role. The ship safely evacuated more than 14,000 refugees, which far exceeded the ship's capacity. Because



of that, it earned the name the "Ship of Miracles." A documentary film was made about the rescue operation. This evacuation is often compared with the British and French withdrawal at Dunkirk in 1940 during World War II.

The Korean War Veterans Memorial: Freedom Is Not Free! 05-03

The Korean War Veterans Memorial located in Washington, D.C. is built to memorialize those who fought and died in the Korean War. On a wall of the memorial, the phrase "Freedom Is Not Free" is engraved. It means that there is a price to be paid for freedom. This saying is often used to express respect for soldiers who gave their lives to keep their countries or other nations free. The plaque in the memorial reads, "Our nation honors her sons and daughters who answered the call to defend a country they never knew and a people they never met." Indeed, the sacrifices of these soldiers during the war should not be forgotten.
