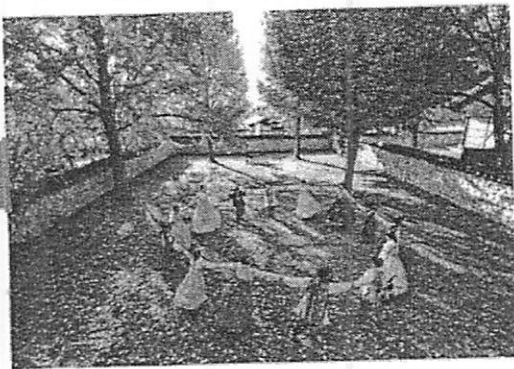

**Folk Games of Chuseok** 07-06



There are different traditional folk games that are played by family members during Chuseok. Women traditionally play a game on seesaws called *neolltwigi*. Another women's activity is a group circle dance called *ganggangsullae*. This dance is typically performed at night under the moonlight. Women hold hands and dance together in a circle. The lead singer sings a line and everyone replies, "Gang-gang-sul-lae." The lyrics usually reflect emotions such as

happiness, anger, sorrow, and love. The song starts slowly and becomes faster as the dance continues. The dance may last until dawn. Men traditionally play *ssireum*, Korean wrestling. In the competition, two men wrestle each other while holding their opponent's belt. To win, a person has to use various techniques to take his opponent down.
